- **3.** The study was delimited to Gujarat state board secondary schools, ICSE (Indian certificate secondary education) schools and Central Board of Secondary schools.

Research Design:-

Case study was used here by the researcher as a research design as this will help in collection and presentation of detailed information about a particular participant.

Tools for the Data Collection:-

- 1. Document study
- 2. Semi structured Interview
- 3. Questionnaire
- 4. Observation

Process of data collection:-

First of all, the researcher took the help of the website from where the information of the schools was available. Then the researcher has made the list of High Performing schools and researcher has also taken the views and suggestions from the academicians regarding the characteristics of High Performing schools. Then the researcher has selected the schools as per the convenient to approach the nearby places and as per permission given by the schools for the data collection. Then the researcher has made the study of documents at the school office. After document analysis, the researcher prepared a list of schools which have above 90 percent result continuously since last three academic years from 2014. The researcher contacted those schools and then selected six such schools which agreed to be part of study and were willing to co-operate for the study. Once the school agreed to be a part of study, the researcher contacted Principal/Director of the school. For the purpose of this study, the researcher used document study, questionnaire, observation, unstructured interviews were used as method of data collection. The

first meeting was an introductory meeting. The researcher explained the nature and purpose of the study with personally meeting so that when the researcher personally meets, the participant is aware of the kind of data needed.

The researcher saw the documents at schools offices and then the researcher gave some questions (Questionnaire) to the teachers regarding the infrastructure facilities of the school, enrolment rate of the students, family background, training programs attended, teaching learning method, co-curricular activities and healthy practices and so on..

Then the researcher also used semi-structured interviews for the information. The researcher interviewed all the six of the principals at their offices, teaching staff were interviewed at their staffrooms. Students were interviewed in their classrooms. The researcher also interacted individually to some of the students who were found moving from one place to another during school visit. To encourage participants to share more details during the interviews, the researcher listened attentively. During the course of the interviews field notes were taken to help the researcher more effectively grasp what was observed, experienced, perceived, and reflected during and after each interview in the field. The researcher met the teachers and principal twice or thrice depending upon the need.

The researcher randomly visited the house of some of the students to observe the conditions in which they live and interacted with their parents. The researcher prepared the field notes of what the researcher saw, heard, experienced and thought on the field. These field notes of data were further analyzed to get the understanding of the case.

Then the researcher also used questionnaire for the verification of the information which were not getting from semi-structured interviews. The questionnaire was also made for the Principal, teachers and parents. They responded/filled out very well.

Then the researcher used the observation as a tool for information. The researcher observed some of the documents during the visits to school. Documents such as school register, daily lesson plan diary, projects- assignments given to the children, photographs of the annual day function, sports day and co-curricular activities photographs, competition, advertisement for enrolment of the students were studied. The researcher randomly observed some of the classes in each school to understand the teaching learning process. The teacher whose class was to be observed was not informed beforehand.

If the researcher while preparing the case felt later on that some information is missing or needed further clarification, she used to note down and contacted the concerned person telephonically.

Data Analysis:-

For data analysis, whatever gathered data, were read number of times. The data were closely examined in order to find constructs, themes that can be used to describe and explain case. The major themes which emerged are Reasons for the High Performance and measures. Each Case was analyzed under these major themes. Students' Profile, Teachers' profile, school profile.

Major Findings:-

Teachers:-

- 1. Teachers do the action research to get the solutions of the problems which he/she faces in teaching -learning activities.
- 2. Teachers also take interest in their studies and they also personally give them help to increase the result or achievement. Teachers also take extra classes or remedial sessions by which they clarify the concept clearly and improve the result.
- 3. In these kind of schools, various pedagogies for the instruction use by the teachers to cater the needs of the students such as storytelling, discussion method, review of articles or books, using flash card or cue card, interaction between students and teachers, extempore speech on various topics, poem recitation, seating arrangement with brilliant students, remedial sessions, cooperative learning, constructive method, group discussion, laboratory or demonstration method and peer tutoring and so on...
- 4. In these schools, home work is also assigned to the children and checked or monitored regularly by the teachers.

Students:-

1. Students attend extra classes which are organized by their teachers.

- 2. Most of the students have reading, speaking in English and Mathematics skill by which they sustain with the global competition.
- 3. Most of the students come from nearby areas of the schools and those students come from the far area of the schools, they are facilitated by school bus or van.
- 4. These students have interest in knowledge gaining and they are interested to become something in their life.
- 5. Most of these students have literate parents who have completed minimum graduate level study. Therefore, they understand the importance of education and encourage their children to go to school.

Parents:-

- 1. Parents have high expectations about their child's study. They also spent enough time behind their child's study. They want their child goes to the top level of the education and become some famous personality in their life.
- 2. Environment at home is good and supportive for studies.
- 3. Most of the students' socio-economic background is middle class or higher middle class who can afford the fees of these kinds of schools.

Schools:-

- 1. In these kinds of schools, absenteeism and drop out ratio of the students is very less or rare.
- 2. There are different subject clubs or Houses or Ministries or Hobby clubs are going on in these schools wherein various activities carried out such as guest speech, seminar on E-content development, Social Science Exhibitions, subject wise workshops etc...
- 3. Before entering into primary schools, most of the schools arrange entrance test or competency test for checking the abilities of the students and then according to their scoring, the school provides some special measures to the students to improve their ability or capability.

Conclusion:-

After representation of the different cases of secondary schools, we may conclude from above mentioned findings and discussion that there are number of factors, which affects school's performance. Within last decade, most of the research studies have notice that schools have to focus on their development under whole education system. In addition, we can conclude that these features also would be helpful to the policymakers for the sustainable improvement of the result of the schools. So according to the needs and demands of the society, we have to provide new healthy practices by which we cater the diversity of the students. There is lot of need to monitor and employed improvement efforts.
